**Earth Day**

This month, we will celebrate Earth Day on April 22<sup>nd</sup> to show the importance of we care about our Earth. We will ask the children to bring 1-2 recyclable materials such as cans, bottles, bags, tree branches, and leaves. We will make a large group project using these materials.

The children will learn how they can re-use things that they might have otherwise thrown away. They will also use their creativity and imaginations to turn these materials into a beautiful art project. As this is a large group project, they will also need to learn how to coordinate their ideas and work with each other as a team.
